Demonstrating her heart for mentorship and discipleship, Tanesha helped establish Esther's Court, a mentorship group created to encourage and guide young women in their faith and personal development.

Her love for worship was evident through her service in the praise and worship ministry, where she ministered alongside her sister and many others, lifting her soaring soprano voice in praise unto God. She also faithfully served as an adjutant to both her mother and her leader, carrying out her responsibilities with humility, excellence, and dedication.

Tanesha was a true intercessor whose life of prayer reflected her deep relationship with God. She was a minister of the Gospel who possessed a genuine revelation of God's Word, coupled with a holy fire and an unquenchable hunger for the things of God. She loved studying Scripture, sharing biblical truth, and encouraging others to pursue a deeper walk with Christ.

Tanesha was a steward of God's Word and a woman of sincere faith. She believed in the power of prayer, the grace of God, and the importance of living a life pleasing to Him. She was not afraid to wrestle with difficult questions, trusting that God was faithful enough to meet her in every season of life. Through her testimony, she reflected resilience, authenticity, and a deep desire to know Christ more fully.

Though her time on earth was far shorter than those who loved her hoped, her impact was immeasurable. Her life was marked by faith, love, compassion, laughter, service, and purpose. The prayers she prayed, the lives she touched, the encouragement she gave, and the love she shared will continue to live on in the hearts of all who knew her.

Tanesha leaves to cherish her precious memories her loving parents, Marcus Scott, Sr. and Letisha Scott; her ten beloved siblings, Talia, Marcus Jr., Shakirah, Benjamin, Moriah, Madelyn, Sean, Bryson, Savannah, and Eden.
